

Daily Bible readings for home devotions; July 17-22, '17

Mon Exodus 3:1-15 The One-and-Only who deserves the name of GOD, *I-AM-WHO-I-AM*, simply dismisses any/all bogus “gods” as unworthy of comparison, for no other deity exists. Case closed. This is the LORD God who revealed Himself to Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob—and that’s how Moses should describe Him to the elders of Israel. Stay tuned.

Tues John 21:15-19 Peter’s triple denials were festering in his heart, so Jesus lovingly lanced the abscess. The sore issue: “Peter, are you devoted to Me? Friendly? Companionable? Or what?” The third probe (17) (“Are you even My friend?”) was particularly painful. Jesus assured Peter that during his recovery he would resume shepherd activities.

Wed Acts 9:1-22 A headstrong person needs tough love to knock him off his high horse. During those three days & nights God sent His Spirit to illuminate Saul that Jesus=Messiah, and Saul was totally upset with himself (9) for having been so wrong. He learned how forgiving God can be when Ananias called him “*brother*” and told him Jesus was about to *heal his blindness and fill him with His Spirit*. After some days *with the disciples* (19), Saul was ready to enlighten other blinded Jews.

Thurs Psalm 106:40-48 History lesson: When God’s people defected, God chastened them—and when they repented, God restored them. In tough love He lets rebels suffer consequences (40-43) and brings them to repent (44). We depend on God being merciful to the Nth degree (45), and we praise God for being so generous to us.

Fri Matthew 22:29-32 The Sadducees *didn’t know the power of God* to take souls (still living) into heaven—which they could have known by figuring out what God was actually saying in Exodus 3:6. Those who *don’t know the Bible* don’t know nearly enough about life’s BIG issues.

Sat Acts 20:25-32 Since we should know our limitations, we *take heed to ourselves*, governing our personal quirks and foibles as we serve God and one another (28). Let’s not underestimate threats from others, because even our friends (30) can go wrong theologically. It has happened before, and it can happen again. We stay on guard (31) even as we entrust ourselves *to God and the message of His grace!* May God continue to *build us up in the precious inheritance we share with all the saints!* Praise the Lord!

Old Testament Reading.....Isaiah 55:10-13

"For as the rain and the snow come down from heaven and do not return there but water the earth, making it bring forth and sprout, giving seed to the sower and bread to the eater, ¹¹ so shall my word be that goes out from my mouth; it shall not return to me empty, but it shall accomplish that which I purpose, and shall succeed in the thing for which I sent it. ¹² "For you shall go out in joy and be led forth in peace; the mountains and the hills before you shall break forth into singing, and all the trees of the field shall clap their hands. ¹³ Instead of the thorn shall come up the cypress; instead of the brier shall come up the myrtle; and it shall make a name for the LORD, an everlasting sign that shall not be cut off."

CLC Mission Helpers to Nepal: Seventeen Mission Helpers departed on an evening flight from Chicago on Monday (7/10) on their way to Kathmandu, Nepal where they will be met by Pastor Raju Bhitrakoti, his family, and other pastors and members of the Himalayan Church of the Lutheran Confession of Nepal (HCLCN). These seventeen individuals divided into four teams as they will spend the next three weeks proclaiming the simple Gospel message to approx. 1,500 children in Himalayan villages where HCLCN congregations are located. Partners in Ministry Program: The 2016 CLC Convention approved the Partners in Ministry Program which is designed to link active CLC called servants who have obligations to repay ILC Student Aid Fund loans with sponsors who agree to provide matching funds for payments on those loans. The donor and recipient would remain anonymous to each other. This program is now ready for implementation. There are about a dozen eligible account holders who will be contacted directly to see if they are interested in participating and would then need to fill out an application annually. New Testament Reading.....Matthew 13:1-9,18-23

That same day Jesus went out of the house and sat beside the sea. ² And great crowds gathered about him, so that he got into a boat and sat down. And the whole crowd stood on the beach. ³ And he told them many things in parables, saying: "A sower went out to sow. ⁴ And as he sowed, some seeds fell along the path, and the birds came and devoured them. ⁵ Other seeds fell on rocky ground, where they did not have much soil, and immediately they sprang up, since they had no depth of soil, ⁶ but when the sun rose they were scorched. And since they had no root, they withered away. ⁷ Other seeds fell among thorns, and the thorns grew up and choked them. ⁸ Other seeds fell on good soil and produced grain, some a hundredfold, some sixty, some thirty. ⁹ He who has ears, let him hear."

¹⁸ "Hear then the parable of the sower: ¹⁹ When anyone hears the word of the kingdom and does not understand it, the evil one comes and snatches away what has been sown in his heart. This is what was sown along the path. ²⁰ As for what was sown on rocky ground, this is the one who hears the word and immediately receives it with joy, ²¹ yet he has no root in himself, but endures for a while, and when tribulation or persecution arises on account of the word, immediately he falls away. ²² As for what was sown among thorns, this is the one who hears the word, but the cares of the world and the deceitfulness of riches choke the word, and it proves unfruitful. ²³ As for what was sown on good soil, this is the one who hears the word and understands it. He indeed bears fruit and yields, in one case a hundredfold, in another sixty, and in another thirty."
