Greeting and Prayer

The Epistle Reading: *Philippians 2:5-11*

Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus,⁶ who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped,⁷ but made himself nothing, taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men.⁸ And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross.⁹ Therefore God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name,¹⁰ so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and

under the earth, ¹¹ and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

The Gospel Reading: *John 12:12-19*

The next day the large crowd that had come to the feast heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem. ¹³ So they took branches of palm trees and went out to meet him, crying out, "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord, even the King of Israel!" ¹⁴ And Jesus found a young donkey and sat on it, just as it is written, ¹⁵ "Fear not, daughter of Zion; behold, your king is coming, sitting on a donkey's colt!" ¹⁶ His disciples did not understand these things at first, but when Jesus was glorified, then they remembered that these things had been written about him and had been done to him. ¹⁷ The crowd that had been with him when he called Lazarus out of the tomb and raised him from the dead continued to bear witness. ¹⁸ The reason why the crowd went to meet him was that they heard he had done this sign. ¹⁹ So the Pharisees said to one another, "You see that you are gaining nothing. Look, the world has gone after him."

GOOD FRIDAY TENEBRAE SERVICE: On this coming Friday at 7pm we will be holding a special Good Friday Tenebrae service. In the early Christian Church, a Tenebrae Service was held in remembrance of the suffering and death of our Lord Jesus. During this ancient service a candle was extinguished after each Scripture reading was completed - symbolic of the isolation and suffering of our Lord, and of the dark evil of the sins for which He died. In our worship this Friday we continue that ancient tradition with an adaptation of such a service. During the second half of the service one candle will be extinguished after each of the seven readings are completed, progressively darkening the church. At the end of the service, one candle will remain burning. This is the Christ candle. This candle will remain lighted at the end of the service to symbolize the assurance of His resurrection after three days in the tomb. Our Savior was not overcome by death, but rather He overcame sin and hell through death. Please join us for this special service!

EASTER SUNDAY BREAKFAST AND SERVICE: Our schedule for Easter Sunday begins at 10:00am with an Easter brunch. Omelets and eggs cooked to order, pancakes, waffles, bacon, and sausage! Any able-bodied men willing to help are encouraged to do so. The Easter worship service will begin at 11:00am. There will be no Sunday school or Bible class. Come and worship the Risen Jesus! Be sure to use the ancient greeting with your fellow Christians: "He is risen!" answer: "He is risen, indeed!"

EASTER LILIES: Mt. Zion has the Easter Sunday tradition of decorating the altar/chancel with Easter lilies. If you would like to share a lily or two for the service, please bring it Easter morning! After the service, the lilies will go home with their owners so you can continue enjoying it at home.

BLESSING BAGS: Mt. Zion's womens group L.I.F.T. and the Outreach Committee are coordinating an effort to put together "blessing bags" for the congregation to distribute. The concept is pretty simple: we are collecting donations of a variety of non-perishable items that might be useful to a person living on the street (i.e. bottled water, toiletries, nuts, granola, pretzels, dried fruit, etc.). The donation box is located in the fellowship room. These items will be bagged along with a small, Gospel-driven devotion booklet and made available for our members to hand out to persons who might appreciate it. “PAUL, APOSTLE OF CHRIST” MOVIE REVIEW: This past weekend a movie on the life of the Apostle Paul and the early church in Rome was be released in theaters. CLC Pastor Nathanael Mayhew wrote a nice review of the movie discussing the pros and cons. It has a good cast (Jim Caviezel from Passion of the Christ) and includes some good producing and acting. There were several things Pastor Mayhew didn't like about the movie, but he still feels that it is worth seeing and discussing. It is rated PG-13 for a couple of beating and death scenes, although it is more "situational" and not "sensational" as most movies today are.
